

Lake Accotink Update

Lake Accotink Task Force Gives Citizens A Voice In The Lake's Future

SaveLakeAccotink.org (SLA), a local, citizen-run advocacy group, was created to represent the larger community and work with the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors (Board) and Department of Public Works and Environmental Services (DPWES) to restore Lake Accotink, a man-made reservoir in Fairfax County Park Authority's Lake Accotink Park. The Lake is fed by Accotink Creek which, along with water and natural materials, deposits sediment filled runoff water into the lake which, over time decreases the depth of the lake to less usable levels.

The County studied the feasibility of dredging the lake and in 2019, the Board announced that it could be done at a cost of \$30 million dollars. The Board approved the expenditure and unanimously voted to dredge the lake. Then the Board announced in 2023 that the projected cost of completing the planned dredge would be \$95 million and added costs for additional dredges over a 25 year period would increase the projected cost by \$300 million.



DPWES then recommended that the lake should not be dredged, but be let to fill with sediment and any resulting vegetation. A County run survey was conducted to gather public opinion and a final recommendation was made to cancel the dredging.

Several civic groups, including SLA, along with a multitude of concerned and interested citizens, objected to the recommendation not to dredge and to the methodology used to arrive at the recommendation. The outcry led Supervisor Rodney Lusk, Franconia District, and Supervisor James Walkinshaw, Braddock District, to put a matter before the Board recommending that a task force be established to further and fully consider the issue and produce findings that would inform the Board of Supervisors' decision regarding the future of Lake Accotink. The Task Force on the Future of Lake Accotink was established at the June 6 Board of Supervisors meeting. According to Fairfax County, "Lake Accotink Park is one of Fairfax County's most beloved resources. Its 476.2 acres of natural resources, trails, picnic areas, and waterfront activities draw hundreds of thousands of visitors each year. The 55-acre Lake Accotink, a manmade reservoir originally built by the U.S. Army, is a key feature of the park. However, it has required regular dredging to remove sediment and prevent it from returning to its natural state. The Park attracts crowds with its stunning trails, picturesque picnic areas and engaging waterfront activities."

The Lake Accotink Task Force (Task Force) will review past studies about dredging and ensure comprehensive exploration of all options to preserve Lake Accotink in the most sustainable, equitable and cost-effective manner. It will identify crucial questions to be addressed if the Board decides to explore a managed wetland or hybrid option. The group will also consider the environmental impact, effects on surrounding communities, recreational park usage and financing implications, including ongoing maintenance. *"This task force will enable community members to be at the table to ensure that options are thoroughly explored, and that questions from the public are answered,"* said **Braddock District** <u>Supervisor James R. Walkinshaw.</u>

The Task Force, co-chaired by former BOS Chairman Sharon Bulova and former Braddock Supervisor John Cook, has established three subcommittees, each with a focus on a different aspect of its research and goals. Those subcommittees will focus on: 1) Options to Consider Other Than Full Traditional Dredging; 2) The Value of Lake Accotink To Lake Accotink Park; and 3) Analysis of Staff Recommendation to Not Dredge. The subcommittees will report back to the Task Force, who will report their findings to the Board in December of 2023.

Community Needs are Not Decreasing

ECHO conselors see clients of appointment, and those appointments are filling for days. If not weeks, in advance. Need in our community seems to be growing-especially for food! When we run low on donated food staples, we have to purchase them. Recently, food donations have not met the increased requests, so ECHO is buying more and more. Please help if you are able.

A most urgently needed supplies at this time are: cooking oil. Shelf-stable milk, instant coffee, sugar, sardines, canned meat, and children's toothbrushes. Echo's donation Door is open on weekdays from 9:30-12:30pm, and Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday evenings, 7:30 to 9:00pm. There are also food collection boxes for ECHO (**food only, please**) in the lobbies of the Braddock District, West Spring-field District and Franconia District Government Offices.


In Memoriam

Goodyear charts the life and times of one of the most remarkable Americans ever to win the Presidency. Progressive firebrand and conservative compromiser; Union war hero and founder of the first Department of Education; Supreme Court attorney and abolitionist preacher; mathematician; the last president to be born in a log cabin; the second to be assassinated. James Abram Garfield was all these things and more. Over nearly two decades in Congress during a polarized era Garfield served as a peacemaker in a Republican Party and America defined by divisions. He was elected President to overcome them. He was killed while trying to do so.


